## RULES AND REGULATIONS

### ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY

- A) Academic Requirements for admission to M.Sc. Programme: Candidates who have passed B.Sc. Agriculture or B.Sc. Horticulture with 70% marks in aggregate from a recognised university are eligible to apply for admission to the M.Sc. courses: The minimum marks for admission to the above courses are relaxed as per the government rules of relaxation i.e. 3% relaxation for OBC and 5% relaxation for ST/SC candidates.
- B) Academic Requirement for admission to B.Sc. Programmes: Candidates who have passed 10+2 with 50% marks in aggregate in Science with Biology as a subject from a recognized Board- Indian or foreign are eligible to apply for admission to the above B.Sc. courses. No relaxation on the ground of participation in sports and games or extra-curricular activities or any other ground, whatever, shall be made in determining the eligibility. However, the minimum marks for admission to the above courses are relaxed as per the rule of relaxation of marks of the MU i.e. 3% relaxation for OBC and 5% relaxation for SC/ST candidates.

### HOW TO APPLY

Candidates can get the Application Form from the Office of the Institute on payment of Rs. 500/ (Rs. 300 for SC & ST Candidates) during office hours. Application forms can also be downloaded from the institute's website: [www.sairam.org.in](http://www.sairam.org.in) and submit the duly filled in application form with relevant documents. The candidates who downloaded the application form from the website should pay the application fee of Rs. 500/- (Rs. 300 for SC & ST Candidates) at the time of submission of the form in cash or Demand Draft drawn in favour of SAIRAM, payable at Imphal. The duly filled in Application Forms should reach the Office of Director, SAIRAM on or before the last date of submission of the Forms.

## SELECTION PROCEDURE

- a) Duly filled in prescribed application form along with supporting documents must be submitted to the Institute by the last date notified.
- b) The candidates will be shortlisted based on the marks **secured** in the B.Sc. Agriculture and 10+2 (10th Standard for the Short-term Courses) Examination of the concerned Board and merit list will be prepared accordingly for the specified number of seats.

## ENROLLMENT & REGISTRATION

The candidates admitted to the courses shall register themselves by surrendering their migration/transfer certificates and other relevant documents as per Manipur University rules.

## HOSTEL FACILITY

The Institute has Girls and Boys hostels. The hostel fees can be paid on actual as per the type of facilities the students are looking for. The identified Hostels are at the walking distance from the Institute (Monthly rent of Rs 2000 and mess fee of Rs 4000 per month).

## LIBRARY FACILITY

Currently, the library has more than 1000 titles on the subjects introduced in past few academic years. It is equipped with highly relevant and up-to-date text and reference books. Additions would continue with books and journals every year

## COMPUTER AND AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS

The Institute has well equipped classrooms with the latest LCD panel projectors and networking with the up to-date computer configuration. The Institute has a well-equipped computer centre with up-to-date computer configuration and internet connection for exclusive use by students. A good network of audio-visual teaching aids is available to the students.

## PLACEMENT CELL

The placement Cell of the Institute is managed by a Placement Committee consisting of Chairman of the Board of Directors, faculty members, and representatives of the students and industries under the overall guidance of Training & Placement Officer. The Cell acts as a channel of communication between the students and the employing organizations to help each full-time student to plan his/her career and find suitable job. The Cell provides appropriate facilities for campus recruitment to employers seeking professionally trained managers.

## ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH COMMITTEE

The institute has a Academic and Research Committee under the Chairmanship of its Director. The objective is to establish a close linkage between the academics, industries and other allied institutions to take up feasibility studies, Capacity Building Initiatives, Project Report Preparation, Entrepreneurship Development Programmes, Farmer's Development Programmes, and Market Research Studies. In order to further strengthen the linkage with industry and other organizations, focused seminars and workshops are also organized for the benefit of the practicing farmers, rural people, and managers.

- A. The examination for each semester will consist of internal assessment and written examination in each paper if not specified otherwise for any specified paper. Institute will adopt the Manipur University Ordinance/Rule for the Examination.
- B. The prescribed application form for the written examination must be filled up and submitted along with the proof of the payment of the examination fee by the students duly forwarded by the Director/Principal of the Institute within the date notified by the Controller of Examinations, Manipur University.  
The Director of the Institute shall certify.
  - i) The eligibility of the student for appearing at the examination.
  - ii) The good conduct of the student.
  - iii) The fact that the student has attended not less than 75% of lectures in each paper separately during the semester in question.
  - iv) The fact that the student has secured minimum pass marks in internal assessment in each paper separately.

## **ATTENDANCE**

Every student must secure at least 75% attendance in each paper, failing which he/ she shall not be allowed to appear at the examination. No relaxation in attendance for any reason, whatsoever, shall be granted.

## **MEDIUM**

English shall be the medium of instruction and that of examination including entrance test, group discussion and personal interviews.

## **FEEES**

- ◆ The admission fees are to be cleared in three installments at the time of admission, 2<sup>nd</sup> installment before the end of third month of the semester, 3<sup>rd</sup> installment after the third month of the semester with late fine of Rs100/day.
- ◆ Examination fee at the end of each semester

Fees once paid will not be refunded. The amount of fees for examination and registration may vary from time to time.

## **CERTIFICATES**

If a student wishes to take transfer certificate during the year, the student must clear all fees.
